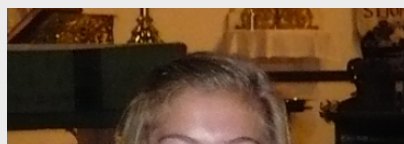
Friends in Christ,
